Policy for NBC Assembly Signing on to Policy Letters/Initiatives

The following policy was approved by the NBC Assembly on June 10, 2022. It was amended to add the option for an email vote when no Assembly meeting is scheduled and a timely vote is required. The motion passed with 18 in favor and 1 opposed.

Before a letter supporting an action or an issue can be brought to the Assembly for approval, it:

- Must support one of the priorities of the social justice task force
- Requires background information, educational and/or advocacy efforts that involve the SJTF and members of the congregation
- Must include adequate lead time for the Assembly to review the request

Passage of a motion to sign the letter requires at least 75% of those voting in person **or via email** to vote in favor. (Note: In case of an email vote, all voting members of the Assembly will be sent a request for a vote. The 75% tally of the vote will be taken of the email replies, not of the total number sent.)

Joanne will amend the policy in the Assembly minutes that the vote will be taken at EITHER an Assembly Meeting OR through email, not both.

Social Justice Task Force Bulletin Board

Anne Coughlin asked that we check out the Social Justice Task Force bulletin board.

Reproductive Justice Leadership from Brackett.

Caron has been looking out for what is going on nationally. Organizations are looking for donations from people who are not in a state at risk.

Fundraising

Organizations providing reproductive justice support:

- Bridget supplies dollars for women in pregnancies past 15 weeks: funding for travel and the abortion.
- The Abortion Federation provides counseling.
- AID Access.org triage offering abortion pills for places already shut down

We need to stay focused to help the most-at-risk. Do we do something that's short-term or long-term? Both? Intersectionality of issues are bound up in this. Plan for the long-haul fight.

Possible Partners: Hope Gateway; Maine Council of Churches; Planned Parenthood of Northern New England (Suggestions: donate, amplify **abortion finder.org**; sign up to volunteer)

The group made a commitment to do some fund-raising and come up with a process to decide which fund to support. People may need opportunity to talk about this; possibly lead a conversation about next steps for the island and feeling so battered; provide a place for reflection and nurturing. How can we help kids who are scared by this?
